(plan for spring break or summer vacation) • Keep up your grades!

If in need of help, ask to see your Career Counselor or visit the Career Center • Attend Junior meeting with Academic Counselor • Start looking at scholarship options • Keep up your grades! 	<p>March</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look in to summer opportunities that would look good on college applications and scholarship applications (volunteering, leadership) • Start visiting college campuses • Register for and PREPARE for the ACT and/or SAT exams 	<p>April</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take your first ACT exam • Work on summer opportunities (Girl’s State, Boy’s State) • Plan more college visits • If playing sports, register with the NCAA clearinghouse and check eligibility requirements • Keep up your grades! 	<p>May</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take SAT exam • Take ACT exam again • Plan community service opportunities and participate in them (very important for college applications as well as scholarship applications) • Keep up your grades! 	<p>June</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take SAT I & SAT II exam • Take ACT exam again • Start visiting colleges, schedule tours and meetings with admission representatives
